L&A Studio Tour Signs

Aluminum signs: To be erected early summer on your art studio lawn or location.

- Attach 2 wooden steaks to aluminum sign with 4 screws and 4 washers, or whatever works best in your location.
- Clean the sign.
- Attach vinyl peel and stick tour dates plus studio number.
- There should be Vinyl white squares covering incorrect drilled holes in aluminum but these are not necessary.
- **TIP:** If your sign does not include drill holes to attach to the stakes, you will need to drill them yourself or get a friend to do so,
- TIP: You may find that a cordless 1/4" drill bit is helpful to break through gravel or limestone.



Plastic signs: To be erected the Thursday before the tour and removed no later than noon on the Monday after the tour. (We are complying with L&A County bylaws.)

- A bundle of 10 plastic signs with 10 wire "H" legs and 20 vinyl peel and stick arrows for each side of the plastic sign (if applicable one arrow depending on your road locations).
- Clean signs and apply vinyl peel and stick arrows to **both** sides so that arrows are **facing towards the same end of the sign**.
- Place plastic signs on intersections near your studio and surrounding higher traffic areas.
- You will need a cordless 1/4" drill bit to break through gravel or limestone. Be aware of long straight stretches, double up signs 10' apart and before intersections so vehicles can make the turns safely and correctly.
- L & A County is allowing us to put signs out as long as the bylaws are being followed. 3' road allowance from centre of yellow line to edge of road+ 3' more = 33' total.
- Be mindful of hogweed, parsnip and tics near ditches and NOT impeding traffic while putting signs out nor interfering with any other road sings where they stand. Be safe.
- Artists are responsible to clean plastic signs with a damp cloth and brush off dirt from "H" wires before returning. Return details TBD.
